

Call for Presentations

Each year the International Graphic Arts Education Association (IGAEA) sponsors a summer conference. Conference events are mini-seminars that provide a diverse and unique educational experience offered in a wide variety of areas of interest to graphic communication educational professionals. Experts in the field, as well as IGAEA members considered to be the leaders in education, present these seminars.

The 84th Annual IGAEA Conference 2008 is scheduled for July 26 – August 2, 2008, and will focus on the improvement of classroom instruction and content. All presentations will be directly applicable to units of study at a variety of levels and subjects in the classroom. The presenters will summarize a lesson that they use. The presentation will include an explanation of where it fits in the curriculum, the student level of experience, and typical stumbling blocks to student achievement and evaluation guidelines. The conference participants will receive all of the parts of the lesson and teaching tips on a compilation CD/DVD for use in the classroom.

The program presentations will be limited in many respects because there are no lab facilities available for individual hands-on instruction. We believe by focusing the conference on classroom instruction, we can have a valuable and enlightening experience for all.
